Roll Netting

Did you know: big roll sod is rolled in a biodegradable net to help hold the sod together as the harvester rolls it up?

The netting provides a backing to the soil side of the roll which will help hold it together and provide ease for installing the sod. The netting used is biodegradable; however, it does take quite a long time for the net to biodegrade. Often times, the grass will wear down in high traffic areas before the net has a chance to biodegrade. If this occurs, it becomes a safety hazard for players, as their cleats will get caught up in the net. Since safety is the top priority, the netting is removed from the back side of the rolls when installing big roll Bermuda grasses on athletic fields.

Bermuda as a whole is a dense grass that is cultivated specifically to be of top quality for athletic (cont'd page 2)

fields and golf courses. Bermuda is the industry standard for these intalls thanks to its durability and tolerance of high foot traffic.

On the opposite end of the spectrum, we have Bahia that also can be harvested in big rolls, which is

our preferred installation method of Bahia. Where these big rolls differ;

however, is the netting. While Bahia still very much uses netting while harvesting, the netting is not removed from the back side of Bahia rolls, as it is not as dense as Bermuda, and is a lower quality grass than Bermudas. Given its makeup as a naturally growing pasture grass, the rolls would fall apart if the netting were removed.

This is one main reason why big roll Bahia is not a good option for athletic playing fields.

Rain Forecast

As we gear up for the rainy season, it's important to try to plan ahead as much as possible when scheduling. If you know that you have slopes on your job site that are at risk of washing out, please call head and get on our schedule well in advance of when you expect to be ready to have them sodded.

We will always do what we can to protect your site & accommodate your schedule; however, we are often at the mercy of mother nature, especially through the rainy season. We don't want you to have to re-work your sites, we want to get them sodded the first go-round; however, our schedule is limited (as we discuss further on page 3), so we are limited in what we can acommoplish in any given time period.

Additionally, as we move into the rainy season, we fully expect rain days. We will always do our best to stay on schedule; however, once the fields are too saturated, sod is physically impossible to harvest until they dry back out a bit. In some cases that's a few hours, in others it's a few days. Please be patient as we try our best to stay on schedule & get everything completed.

Scheduling Sod

The summer months are always the hardest on our schedule. Our top priority is helping our customers complete their projects in a timely fashion, which involves planning ahead. If you know you're going to need sod on your project, we urge you to reach out to us sooner rather than later. We are regularly scheduling 2+ weeks in advance, and cannot often accommodate a same-week install. Sometimes we can accommodate a next-week install, but we cannot guarantee it. When you know you're scheduling your dirt/grading crew or subcontractor, give us a call then - even if that means it's a rough estimate for timeline - we can always adjust if we need to, but knowing



what jobs we have forthcoming is a huge positive in keeping our schedule in good shape. Another thing to keep in mind is that while Bahia is plentiful, more specialized varieties like Bermudas & Zoysias tend to sell out over the summer months, so make sure to get your order in early As we move into the rainy season, this gets complicated more by rain days, but we will work with you and do everything we can to stay on schedule - we just ask that you work with us too!
